

- The majority of the activities and budget must be geared to activities relating to the agricultural sector.
- The main purpose of the SSNUP is to finance the intervention of a technical assistance provider and/ or to co-finance the salary for the recruitment of a staff member specialized in the discipline of the mission.
- The following are not eligible:
  - The financing of a feasibility/market study only, without subsequent implementation;

- The renewal of a certification;
- Funding of recurrent costs;
- Enrolment in external training courses (such as Boulder, Frankfurt School, etc.);
- The acquisition of equipment is strictly limited: only computer equipment intended for the project, within the limit of 30% of the total project budget.



### III. STEPS FOR SUBMITTING A PROJECT

# STEP 1 REQUEST

The organisation completes the "Project Form" and the "Terms of Reference" to describe its need for technical assistance and sends the documents to the **GCAF**.

# STEP 3 APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATION:

An **SSNUP** Selection Committee is set up. The project may be approved, refused or changes may be requested.

#### STEP 2

## PREPARATION OF THE SSNUP APPLICATION

The **GCAF** prepares the application, in cooperation with the organisation, and sends it to **SSNUP** donors. Exchanges are necessary between the organisation and the GCAF at this stage in order to prepare the application.

### STEP 4 LAUNCH OF THE MISSION

The Foundation initiates the contracting process with the organisation and the TA provider and settles the first installment payment. The Foundation reserves the right not to submit incomplete project proposals to the **SSNUP** and/or to stop the process if the organisation is not committed to the preparation.

The selection of the consultant is done according to the Foundation's procurement rules. The invitation to tender may be published before or after the application is approved by the **SSNUP**.
